WHERE IS JESUS "FOR YOU"?

From Pastor

Dear Hearers and Speakers of God's Word,

O Lord, open my lips, and my mouth will declare Your praise! Psalm 51:15

Words originate from God. In the beginning God spoke. What God spoke, appeared. The words of God always perform. God's Word has power. The words of God reveal Him, His character, His salvation. The lips of Jesus spoke the blessed words the fallen world needs to hear. To hear the voice of Jesus is to hear the voice of God.

Jesus has told His Church to speak His Words. His spoken word is to be heard, believed, and spoken more. So shall we pray, "O Lord, open MY lips, and my mouth will declare your praise." What a profound part of our sacrifice of prayer and praise!

God's Word is not a mere trifle, though. Because it always does what it says, we need to be in the place where God's Word performs for us as He says. We need to be where Jesus is, where His Word performs for us in Church.

Now, some say "But Jesus is God and He is everywhere." True! Jesus is risen and ascended and now fills all things! Yet we must consider, where is Jesus "for you"? Yes, Jesus is everywhere, even in the mud on the bottom of your shoe. But can that mud speak to you? Can that mud save you? Would you eat that mud for the forgiveness of your sins? Of course not! Jesus promised to be somewhere for you! He promised with His Word and His Word is made visible and tangible with His body in the bread and His blood in the cup of the Lord's Supper. He speaks and gives them to us to eat and drink for the forgiveness of our sins. Jesus' saving, loving, and forgiving presence is for you in worship on Sundays (Divine Service), unlike everywhere and anywhere else in the world.* God's Word is the performative life creating, life giving, and life restoring word for you. Receiving God's Word affects you just as His Word affected creation in the beginning: He made all things new and makes you new! As forgiven and restored creatures, God Himself opens our lips to declare His praise and speak and share His Word. Even more, He opens our lips to receive in our mouths (as soiled and dirty, vulgar, and profane as our lips and mouths and been with our words) Jesus' body and blood, touching us with His Word and presence, forgiveness and life, in bread and wine.

God's Word does what it says. Where is God's Word doing what is says "for you"? As He sustains and upholds all things by the word of His power, God the Son presents Himself for you in His Church, with His presence. It is supernatural, unlike anything else in this world. He opens your lips by His Word that you declare His praise, receive His Word and Sacraments, and are again made new as like the newness of creation when God first spoke His Holy Words into existence for your eternity with Him. All this He declares "very good."



At 7:00 - 7:15 Catechism class and the Rocks will gather in the church for a closing with Word and prayer.




